Organized again this year by the Jaguar dealer as an exercise in a safe ice driving experience and off road for the Land Rovers. This year they moved the event to the old Sweat Estate at the northwest corner of Gray's Bay on Lake Minnetonka. The estate has been developed with "to die for" homes which I'd estimate start somewhere between \$1-2 million and escalate rapidly.

We were all vectored to the parking lot and shuttled to the neighborhood activity center which would make a large resort proud. They had sweets, great chili, cornbread, and hot drinks (non-alcoholic).

Dave Meek was having at a young home development salesman last I saw him. The young man asked Dave if he had children and Dave replied he had but they were a hassle and he got rid of them. The salesman hesitated but didn't miss a beat and kept right on with his sales pitch.

Dick Bass and I were the only other Jag Club members in attendance. We both drove the XF which is amazing. The car has three handling/safety modes: regular, traction control, and snow. In regular, a driver could do loops on the ice without really trying due to the rear wheel drive and high horsepower. Traction control mode was a major improvement with some loss of feel and a sense that the car was starting to make some decisions. In snow mode it was "fly by wire" and the car would not let you mess up. If you got into a corner too hot, it sequentially braked different wheels as necessary and took the throttle away from you. Absolutely amazing! I tried to fool that car for 20 minutes and failed completely. It just would not allow me to be stupid.

On the way back, I was asked to ferry some other visitors in the top Land Rover model. I was a little unimpressed being a longtime Suburban driver. It handled well enough, but felt small and insubstantial even though it outweighed a Suburban by almost a ¹/₂ ton.



CARS AND COFFEE First Saturday of each Month by Gene Berghoff

It's tough to roll out of bed on Saturday mornings, but Auto-MotorPlex in Chanhassen Minnesota has made it easier. They provide a wake-up-call that most car enthusiasts love to hear; the fierce roar of a Jaguar, the shriek of a Ferrari, the smooth clatter of a Maserati, the grumble of assorted muscle cars, and other mechanical melodies played by any number of vehicles (including motorcycles) built over the past 100 years.

Known as "Cars and Coffee", an event that is rapidly becoming popular across the US, is growing in large numbers at AutoMotorPlex in Chanhassen, Minnesota on the first Saturday of every month. The automotive collectors come in early to get a parking spot, a cup of coffee and donuts, and unite with other automotive and motorcycle collectors.

On April 4, 2009, several hundred cars showed up even though the weather was cool, cloudy and questionable. Bruno Silikowski, of AutoMotorPlex, displayed his newly constructed club house. Many of the auto condo owners opened their garages displaying their toys and beautifully constructed spaces (wide screen TV's, video games, bathrooms, kitchens, fireplaces, etc). It's the most comprehensive free-form car show anywhere in Minnesota; and what's cool is that it happens every month and with each show it gets better; nice people, nice cars and interesting garages to tour where you see even more toys.

I of course showed up in an XKE Jaguar roadster. As I drove down the crowded roadway to get to my favorite parking spot the crowd came to a standstill and people rapidly pulled out their







cameras. I could hear the silent cry "It's a Jaguar". I always find it interesting that among a sea of expensive exotic sports cars, many of them newer and much more exotic than an XKE, the classic Jaguars continue to demand the utmost respect from collectors of all ages. 



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UPGRADE of the 4.0L XJS

Gloria's 1994 XJS proved to be one of the best all around driving cars I've ever been in. As most of you know, we drove down to the '07 Jaguar Nationals in Indy. We did freeways, back roads at speed, and the Brickyard. My only complaint was the lack of snap. The 230 hp book value spreads thinly across a generally heavy car, but boy did it handle well with a super smooth ride and tight cornering with no side slip.

So then, what to do about extra horses. After my due diligence research there was only one avenue to follow. AJ6 Engineering in England is the platform which Roger Bywater established after he left Jaguar/Ford. He developed upgrade packages for both the 6 and 12 cyl engine built in the 80's & 90's.

We initially tried to work through a "dealer" in Texas who turned out to be bogus. The short story (you don't want to hear the long one) was that the deal was consummated directly with Roger.

Dave Meek and I, of course, consider ourselves quite a team, and we approached the mass of wires, tubes and pipe with tools, camera and scratch pad. Out came the air box, air flowmeter body, throttle body, injectors, injector rail, intake manifold, and all associated appurtenances. What a puzzle! Everything then went off to England for modification.

AJ6 offers their packages in pieces, each assigned a horsepower increase. I went whole hog which included a new complete exhaust system. The project seemed rather straight forward but the amount of disassembly and reassembly had us worried. "Lo & behold" when back together, one key turn produced a smoothly running engine. I won't claim Dave and I weren't a little surprised, but we'd had a few beers by that point and just shrugged and said "Well, sure".

Technical details include new high flow air filter, new air meter logic chip, highly modified internals on the intake manifold, and free flow exhaust system w/o catalytic. The addition is 75 hp which adds up to305 hp total.

Obviously, the power is felt. Performance at speed is really neat. Mileage is up 2 mpg and the car now rumbles. Gene Berghoff, upon first hearing it run, was all smiles.

Did we like it? Was it worth the dollars and time? Would I do it again? Absolutely! If any in the club would like a test drive, just give us a call. I recommend however that they wait for the summer roads. Even with it in "snow mode" selection, there's a bit much horsepower for questionable road conditions.

Dave decided that it would be just the thing for Kim's (ex John Gareau) 4.0 I she recently acquired. Her answer was "NO" in that tone of voice that men revere and obey. We haven't exactly given up but are holding back for a better day and perhaps a bottle or two of wine judiciously applied.
