

# **Architectural Supports** Examining the Jaguar XJ-S's controversial "flying buttress" roof

ow do you follow up a modern legend?

During its 1961-1974 production run, Jaguar's E-type (commonly in America, XKE) was often hailed as one of the most beautiful cars in the world. Its curvaceous-some might say salacious-lines combined aerodynamics and aesthetics into a masterful whole. Those lines had become quite familiar by the end of the V-12 Series III's life, dating the car to the decade from which it sprang. This car's replacement, the first prototype of which was completed in 1969, took a different tack in both demeanor and design; the XJ-S was a polarizing design that, against the odds, stood the test of time.

Jaguar's founder, William Lyons, hired talented aerodynamicist Malcolm Sayer in 1950 to develop his sports cars for endurance racing at France's famous 24 Hours of Le Mans race, with the famously successful XK120 C (AKA the C-type) and subsequent D-type as stellar results. With Lyons's input, Sayer designed the E-type, which owed its shape to the aforementioned racing specials; he also drafted the luxury grand tourer that became the XJ-S.

This new GT traded voluptuous curves for crisp, beveled edges and taut surfaces, as was the style in the 1970s. The long-hood/short-deck proportions were still there, but unlike the E-type, the XJ-S wouldn't come as a convertible—at least, not until a factory-developed one was built in the mid 1980s. Very differ-




ent from the fixed-head E-types and their side-opening rear hatch was the new coupe's roof and rear deck treatment, which was a traditional notchback trunk with unusual C-pillar sail panels that cradled a small rear window.

Author Heiner Stertkamp discusses the car's roof treatment in his tome, *Jaguar: The Complete Story*; "A distinguishing feature of the new development line was its so-called 'flying buttresses' extended C-posts à la Ferrari [Dino] 246 GT, a car Sayer had much been impressed by. Sayer had finished the styling of the project car before his premature death in 1970. He was convinced that the extension of the rear pillars to the rear of the car would perfectly guide the passing airstream to the typical rear vortex. For this reason, they had already been added to some of his later race designs."

Jaguar's own dealer literature reinforced this conclusion, as the car's 1975 launch brochure explained: "Aerodynamic forces are harnessed to contribute quite dramatically to the extraordinary roadholding and stability of the XJ-S.... The aerodynamic profile of the Jaguar XJ-S owes much to the flair of the late Malcolm Sayer, whose work was so successful on the famous sports racing Jaguars. The airflow pattern has been specifically designed not merely to reduce drag, but to harness the aerodynamic forces to increase stability and hold the car down firmly on the road at high speeds." Indeed, this competitor to the Mercedes-Benz 450 SLC could reach 150 MPH in home-market form.

The XJ-S raised evebrows upon its introduction at the fall 1975 Frankfurt auto show, and its wide black quarter window trim and avant-garde flying buttresses would remain the car's hallmark, despite being modified for a smoother appearance in 1991. Outside of mid-engine exotics like the Lamborghini Countach and Ferrari 308 and Testarossa, this roof styling treatment was not otherwise copied, reinforcing the Jaguar's uniqueness. The more than 115,000 XJ-S variants built during its 20-year production run confirm that a select group of enthusiasts liked their luxurious V-12s wrapped in a uniquely styled package. 🛎

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
