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HONEY - THE NEIGHBORS Bought a rolls royce!

Hannelore was right. What the neighbors just bought looked indeed like a Rolls Royce. And the similarities to the aristocratic marque were intentional. The year was 1951 and William Lyons was not a Sir yet. He also was not shy to directly attack Rolls Royce and Bentley with a luxury four-door sedan named the Jaguar Mark VII (later Mark VIII and Mark IX). The similarities to Rolls Royce ended abruptly when comparing price lists. The Jaguar Mark VII cost less than half of a comparable Rolls Royce. Take that, Emily!

Launched at the 1950 British International Motor Show in London, the Jaguar Mark VII was powered by the newly developed XK engine also used in the XK120. The 3442 cc (210 ci) DOHC straight-six provided 160 bhp which propelled the 3,696 lb (1,676 kg) car to over 100 mph. Soon after its start in 1951, production was moved to a new factory at Browns Lane (Jaguarstyle, moving one department at a time, usually over the weekend). The brand-new slogan 'Grace Space and Pace' seemed a fitting description for the beautiful car. In 1952 the Mark VII became the first Jaguar to offer an automatic transmission.

In 1956, the Jaguar Mark VII evolved into the Mark VIII which retained its Lyons-signature design and featured a new grill, relocated fog lamps, a chrome strip along the waistline and a one-piece slightly curved windshield (sorry, windscreen). In 1959, the Jaguar Mark IX increased the engine size to 3781 ci (231 ci) and 220 bhp, offered four-wheel servo-assisted Dunlop





disc brakes and recirculating ball power steering. Between 1951 and 1961 a total of 47,205 cars were built.

Today, the Jaguar Mark VII / VIII / IX is a sought after collectible luxury sedan and - you might have guessed it - it still costs less than half of a comparable Rolls Royce. The fact that it looks better than a Rolls Royce is heavily disputed by Rolls Royce enthusiasts. In March 2013 Hemmings Sport & Exotic raced a Rolls-Royce Silver Cloud III and a Jaguar Mk IX down the quarter mile and the Jaguar outperformed the heavier Rolls at 17.6 seconds (almost identical to a 1961 Austin Healey 3000 MK I).

JAGUAR COMPANY NEWS



Jaguar Losing Money (That's News?) – Jaguar Land Rover reported a record loss of £3.6bn for its April 2018 to March 2019 fiscal year. A weak Chinese market, people falling out of love with Diesel engines and a one-time write-down of £3.1bn in property and machinery (read: internal combustion engine machinery) did a number on the numbers. Excluding one-time items, JLR lost £358m with revenue down to £24.2bn (from £25.8bn). Sales fell by 5.8% to 578,915 vehicles. On the positive side, fourth quarter profit is up to £120m and sales in the UK and US are up over 8%.

Tata Selling Jaguar or Not – Large corporations run dozens of merger, acquisition and divestiture scenarios and most of them end up in an archive and never get executed. Any scenarios with merit will likely get denied until the deal is either finalized or cancelled. This prevents wild speculation in the stock market. Therefore, Tata's denial does not have much weight. French Groupe PSA (\in 74b revenue, 3.8m vehicles in 2018) which owns Chrysler Europe, Citroen, Opel, Peugeot and acquired British Vauxhall in 2017 is open to talks. More to come.

End Of Production for the XJ - Jaguar Land Rover will end the production of the Jaguar XJ by July 5 2019 after 51 years and about 950,000 cars. This is what early retirement looks like: "Thank you for fifty years of service. Please don't come back." The current generation of XJ has been on the market since 2010. The next generation four door luxury sedan will be all electric and come sometime in 2020. Whether it will once again have an XJ badge has not been decided yet.



Ian Callum Resigns - Jaguar Creative Design Director Ian Callum will resign from Jaguar effective July 1st 2019 after twenty years of service. Callum has been credited with "blowing the dust of Jaguar's classic, old-world designs" with the XF in 2007, the new XJ in 2009 and more recently the F-Type, XE, F-Pace, E-Pace and I-Pace. At age 64 he will pursue other projects and passions but continue to work with Jaguar as a design consultant.


