BRITFEST IN HUDSON WISCONSIN



On September 3rd 1783, the British Empire lost all property East of the Mississippi river and South of Lake Superior to the United States of America in the Peace of Paris. This included a small area at the mouth of the Willow River that was settled in 1840 and later renamed to Hudson, Wisconsin.

To commemorate this devastating loss, the British conquer one block of Walnut Street in Hudson in August of every year. Just instead of rifles, they bring their classic cars like Bentley, Rolls Royce, Lotus, Austin Healey, Mini, Triumph and eleven Jaguars. Welcome to Britfest 2019!

A New Jaguar XJ

The new all electric Jaguar XJ will come sometime in 2021 and will be built at the Castle Bromwich plant. A first teaser at the Frankfurt Motor Show on September 10th 2019 showed a bold rear end with slender taillights that span the entire width of the vehicle. The model also has prominent Jaguar badging and what appears to be a trunk with an integrated spoiler. The overall design appears to be an evolution of the styling language used on the facelifted XE.





Advanced Production Creation Centre Open

Jaguar Land Rover has unveiled a new Advanced Product Creation Centre at its Gaydon headquarters. The new £500 million centre, widely known as the Gaydon Triangle, be a base for almost 13,000 engineers and becomes by far the largest car creation centre in the UK. According to JLR CEO Sir Ralf Speth, the new centre will bring new efficiencies by combining the design, engineering and production purchasing functions of the company — all necessary for current and next-generation Jaguar and Land Rover models — under one roof for the first time in history.

Massive Global Logistics Hub Planned

Jaguar Land Rover plans to build a new gigantic warehouse in Leicestershire, UK. The facility will serve as a global logistics hub for sending spare parts to customers in 80 countries around the world. If the project moves forward the distribution center will have 2.9 million square feet and employ up to 3,500 people when it is fully operational by 2023. (No word yet on how many classic Jaguar XJ-S parts will be reproduced and distributed from there.)



Brexit Safeguard: Close Plants for a Week

Jaguar Land Rover plans to close its U.K. factories for a week in November 2019 to guard against disruption to supply chains from a possible no-deal Brexit, Chief Executive Officer Ralf Speth said. The shutdown will go ahead whether or not Britain seeks an extension to the October 31 deadline for leaving the European Union.

BMW vs. Jaguar

In mid August 2019 a 22-year-old man in India pushed a brandnew BMW into a river because he didn't like the car he received as a birthday gift. *The Times of India* reports the man wanted a Jaguar instead. According to the report, an Indian man named Akash was so upset upon being gifted a BMW 3 Series two months ago that he deliberately moved the luxury vehicle into the Western Yamuna Canal. Unofficial response from Jaguar: "We do not condone this behavior, but we understand."

New Project 8 Record

The Jaguar XE SV Project 8 just broke its own Nurburgring record. In 2017, the Project 8 set the record for quickest sedan around the 12.9-mile Nordschleife, with a lap time of 7:21. In July 2019, thanks to a new tire compound, Jaguar broke its own record, setting a time of 7:18.361. So the quickest four-door at the 'Ring' just got even quicker. WAPPENBURY HALL



During the Victorian age Wappenbury Hall was just a small farmhouse. Every owner since the 1800s expanded the building to make it their own. Today the manor features an oak-paneled reception hall, a drawing room, sitting room, dining room, kitchen, breakfast room, music room, game room, office, utility, two restrooms, two cellars, and a boot room. Outside the estate includes a swimming pool, two tennis courts, formal gardens, and green houses.

In 1937 Sir William Lyons, the founder of the Swallow Sidecar Company and later Jaguar Cars, moved from Gibbet Hill Road, on the outskirts of Coventry, to Wappenbury Hall. During the 1950s and 60s, the Hall appeared in a number of publicity shots for Jaguar Cars. Lyons would have every prototype delivered to the house so that he could get his wife Greta's final opinion before production. Sir William Lyons died at Wappenbury Hall in 1985. His wife, Lady Greta, died the following year. They are both buried in the churchyard of St John the Baptist, Wappenbury, a short distance from the Hall.

In 2016, Wappenbury Hall was on the market for \$9.8 million. Today, the layout of the house is exactly the same as when Sir William owned it with a few tasteful upgrades that match the character of the place. Continuing a long-standing tradition, once a year the current owner allows members of the Jaguar Drivers Club to take pictures of their Jaguars in front of Wappenbury Hall.

JAGUAR XJ-SC VS. TRIUMPH STAG

In the 1970s the United States considered outlawing all convertibles due to crash safety concerns. A few select automakers launched an attempt to design a new safer convertible that would withstand a rollover crash. Of course the new U.S. regulation never made it into law and today these supposedly safer convertibles look like oddballs to some and like rare collector cars to others.

Triumph introduced the Stag 2+2 convertible in 1970. Envisioned as a luxury sports car, all Stags were four-seater convertible coupés, but for structural rigidity – and to meet proposed American rollover standards of the time – the Stag required a B-pillar "roll bar" hoop connected to the windscreen frame by a T-bar. A body color removable hard top with defrost wires on the rear window, full headliner and lever operated quarter windows was a popular factory option for the early Stags, and was later supplied as a standard fitment.

The engine compartment featured a beautiful but controversial 3.0L Triumph V8 with a cast iron block, aluminum heads and one overhead cam per bank. Naturally aspirated with twin Zenith-Stromberg carburetors, the small V8 provided 145 bhp (108 kW) of power and 170 lb ft (230 N m) of torque. Plaqued by cooling and reliability issues, some people dubbed it the worst engine ever made. Since then nifty Stag enthusiasts solved every single problem with a few simple aftermarket upgrades. In nine years, 25,939 Stags were made with only 3,000 sold in the U.S..

Jaguar introduced the Jaguar XJ-SC targa cabriolet in 1983. The car was a fixed profile convertible with removable targa panels and a rear soft top. The coupe's rather small rear seats were removed in order to make space for the removable soft top, making it a 2-seat car. To this date it is one of very few convertibles that you can enjoy open while sitting in the shade (with the targa panels in and the soft top down).

Initially the 'cabby' was available with a new 3.6-litre Jaguar AJ6 straight-six engine and a manual Getrag transmission. In 1985 Jaguar introduced a V12 powered XJ-SC and started offering it in the United States. Despite being a quality reliable convertible, only 5,013 were made. In 1986 coach builder Hess & Eisenhardt started offering convertible conversions and in 1988 Jaguar started offering a full convertible.

Both, the Triumph Stag and the Jaguar XJ-SC offer exclusive targa convertible fun for a fraction of the price of a similar Porsche 911 targa soft top (\$10-20,000 vs. \$100,000+). So if you like convertibles with a roll bar, one of these could be for you.




